Volunteering at Roskilde Festival

The Student Council has cooperated with Roskilde Festival for more than a decade. The most important factor for continuing to cooperate with Roskilde Festival is the fact that it enables all students at RUC (not necessarily members of the Student Council) to meet other volunteers and share in the festival experience.

The compensation the Student Council receives in return for volunteering is a key part of our annual budget and the liquidity it adds, is essential for our ability to host events for the student at RUC.

Our efforts at Roskilde Festival are one of our most volunteer heavy, and as a result we need to put ample resources into the acquisition and care of volunteers. It's important that we make a big effort to hire Roskilde Festival coordinators this year, so our volunteers in the Student Council don't have to take this responsibility. We need to further develop the promotional work we do when attempting to recruit volunteers, in order to target potential future students or current students, who do not see our social media posts.

Tutoring

The Student Council must continue having an active role in Tutoring at RUC. We must continue our collaborations with both RUC and the Tutoring Chairpersonship to ensure a study start that lives up to both the requirements of the university and the wants of the tutors and other volunteers of Tutoring.

The entire structure of tutoring is not functional without the active role of the students. We should therefore also continue to push for RUC to take more financial responsibility and relieve tutors of some of the burden.

Semester start event

The Student Council hosts a Boatrace for new students every year, following the introduction period. The Boatrace is a good tradition to keep because it creates a good sense of community for new students and helps them get to know each other across faculties. It has been a tradition that the Student Council hosts a Semester Start Party at the beginning of the fall semester. We should therefore prioritize to have a semester start event once a year, but how it is planned and the extent of the event should be decided by SEC. If the semester start party falls a different day, SEC should make sure that there is a coherent event. For that reason, the planning and economy surrounding the semester start party will undergo a handover, based on the experiences of the previous semester start party. This handover will be held by the SEC of 2023 and upcoming SEC of 2024.

Political priorities

The foundation of the Student Councils political work is to ensure that RUC continuously strives to improve for the students. On a local level that means that we must continue striving for student involvement throughout RUCs governance structure, and push RUC to make efforts towards getting students into the various Study Boards and Institute Councils. Former years' experience has shown us that we are able to push for bigger change if we work together with the VIPs and TAPs of the university. For the sake of student involvement, we will therefore aim to strengthen our cooperation, by also aiding VIP and TAP in their agendas.

On the national level we shall continue working with DSF and the student councils of other schools of higher educations. We are currently facing cuts on our education, which will impact both the quality of our studies and our wellbeing as students. We must actively push back against these attempts and work to ensure students are play an active role in changes made to our education.

Local councils

The student council should work to improve the relationship between the local councils and help them with various task that they think SR, could help with. The Student Council should work on reviving the inactive/non-existing subject councils. Furthermore, The Student Council should continue to support the work of the existing subject councils.

Comities

The student council should continue to encourage and facilitate an event culture less reliant on alcohol by promoting SEC as a possible source of aid for students seeking to execute nonalcoholic based events and activities. Making it possible for SEC to 'host' more events with the same resource.
